

Baby Alejandra's Twelve Days



in Mexico

On Saturday, January 27th, little baby Alejandra Faith Ratcliff was born in Mexico. The birth went very well, and she was so beautiful. We were in the hospital for three days, and afterwards we went home for two days. However, she wasn't eating well at all and slept almost all the time, so on Thursday night, February 1, we rushed her back to the hospital. They immediately hooked her up to an I.V. and began doing tests to try to find out what was wrong with her.

The next several days were a roller coaster of emotions as Alejandra at times seemed to be improving, and then, at other times, went back to having no appetite and sleeping all the time. The doctors said there seemed to be a big question mark over Alejandra - what is going on? What is causing this to happen? We were in one of the best hospitals in all of Mexico with excellent doctors and a first-class neonatal ward.

Finally, on the eleventh day of her life, the doctor did a certain blood test that he had actually done when she arrived at the hospital; however, this time it showed some abnormal activity in Alejandra's liver. The doctors told us that she had a metabolic problem (something she was born with), which was causing

her liver to have a hard time digesting the proteins in the milk. They said that she was stable, and with a special diet she would start improving.

However, at 4:45 a.m. the next morning, we received a call telling us to come to the room right away because Alejandra was not doing well. We were staying in the hospital, so we immediately rushed down the hall to where she was. We saw her for just a little bit, and then the doctor asked us to step outside. Later, the doctor came in the waiting room and said, "I told you I would always be up front and honest with you. Her liver and other organs are failing. I don't think she has much time left." As soon as they let us, we went back into the room. One time the monitor started flashing red, and immediately the doctors went to work on stabilizing her once again. We were in there the entirety of this time. Throughout the day we sat there and told her that we loved her and that Jesus loved her, held her hand, and sang songs to her like "Jesus Loves the Little Children." Then, a little after 2:30 p.m., the monitors started flashing red again. However, there was nothing left for the doctors to do. The nurse asked my wife, "Would you like to hold her?" My wife held our little baby Alejandra and I held onto her hand as the monitor showed that her heart rate was going down. At 2:38

p.m. on Thursday, February 8th, our little baby girl Alejandra went to be with Jesus.

Alejandra is in a wonderful place - a place of no more hurt or pain or sorrow or grief. She is in a beautiful place of gold and precious stones and mansions. Even though we are hurting and miss her so much, we know there is no better place for her to be than with Jesus.

We don't know what you have been through, but we can assure you that God loves you very much. Our heart's desire is that when your life on earth is over, you will go to a wonderful place of no more hurt or pain - a place where our precious baby girl Alejandra is - a place called Heaven.

There are three simple things you need to understand in order to go to Heaven.

The first thing is that God loves you and wants you to go to Heaven. The Bible says in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." God loved you so much that He sent His Son to die for you so you could go to Heaven.
